On Friday, June 24th, we will be performing a joint Master Mason Degree with King Solomon's Lodge, with each Lodge providing one candidate and officers from both Lodges heavily involved throughout the Degree. This is the first opportunity we have had to perform this Degree for a "live" candidate in over two years, so please try to make every effort to come and support these candidates as they look to complete their journey to Master Mason! Dinner will be at 6:30 p.m., with the Lodge opening at 7:30.

The next day, Saturday, June 25th, Priscilla Chapter (Eastern Star) is holding their annual yard, craft, and bake sale at the Lodge from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. This event is always an important charity fundraiser for them, and I encourage everyone to stop by and check out the various goodies they have to offer.

Lastly, Sunday, June 26th is the annual celebration of Saint John's Sunday. As we know, Masonry has two patron saints in Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Evangelist. We celebrate their days in June and December, respectively, though the June observance has historically been the larger of the two in New Hampshire. On this day, there are two official services held in New Hampshire: one in Rindge at the Cathedral of the Pines at 10:00 a.m. and one in Portsmouth (being held this year at the Portsmouth Masonic Temple). I myself will be attending the service at the Cathedral of the Pines and will be happy to carpool with anyone who wishes to accompany me. Please let me know if you'd like to join me.

Looking ahead to the summer, the William Pitt Tavern is looking to have each Lodge in New Hampshire man the tavern one Saturday over the course of the summer to talk to the public about the tavern and Masonry in general. I've done this myself a number of times, and it's a very fun and rewarding experience to be able to dig into the history a bit, dispel some of the myths, and just generally talk about Masonry with people who are genuinely curious about it.

Also, we are looking at reviving the legendary "Outdoor Degree" towards the end of the summer! The first step in this will be in organizing a site cleanup party one of the weekends during the summer. It's been a good five years (or more) since we've done anything there, so it will take a fair amount of elbow grease to get it up to scratch.
