What Is Happening This Month

We have a very busy month ahead of us!

On Saturday, May 7th, we have the honor of hosting the New Master Mason Seminar presented by the Grand Lodge Education Committee. While this seminar is designed for newly raised Master Masons, it should prove to be of great interest to any Master Mason. The workshops and seminars put on by the Grand Lodge Education Committee are fantastic ways to get a much broader understanding of the various Degrees and history of Freemasonry and are a wonderful way to help kickstart your own search for Light in Masonry. I particularly encourage our new Master Masons to attend this very informative event! Check-in starts at 8:30 a.m. with coffee and donuts; the program commences at 9:00 a.m. and concludes around 2:30 p.m. Lunch is provided.

On Thursday, May 12th, the Wandering Wayfarers will be heading south to visit Charity Lodge in Jaffrey (40 Charlonne St.). One of the greatest joys in Masonry is the ability to travel to other Lodges and receive Light in Masonry with new and interesting Brethren. Come and join us in our travels! Dinner is at 6:30 p.m., with Lodge opening at 7:30 p.m. A carpool will be leaving the I-89 Exit 2 Park & Ride at 5:20 p.m. (RSVP to Worshipful Master by the day before so we don't leave without you!).

At our Stated Communication on Thursday, May 19th, we will be opening on the Fellowcraft Degree and our own Right Worshipful Rob Anderson will be providing a program specifically tailored to that Degree. Due to it being the "middle" of the three Degrees, the Fellowcraft Degree tends to get left behind when it comes to education, so please come and contribute to the discussion! As usual, dinner will be at 6:30 p.m., with Lodge opening at 7:30 p.m.

Just two days after our Stated Communication, the 233rd Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire will be held on Saturday, May 21st, in Manchester. The Worshipful Master, Wardens, and Grand Lodge Representative are required to attend, and all Master Masons are encouraged to attend—particularly newly raised Master Masons. In keeping with Horace Chase Lodge tradition, I would like to invite any Brother who is attending Grand Lodge to join me for breakfast at Bridge Café on Elm (1117 Elm St., Manchester) at 7:30 a.m.—my treat! For any Brother who does not wish to join me for breakfast, Grand Lodge opens promptly at 9:30 a.m., and dues cards will be checked.

Finally, we close out the month with a very special event: the Penacook Memorial Day Parade. For decades (and more), towns and villages across the country held annual Memorial Day parades to honor those servicemen who had fallen in defense of our freedoms, a tradition that has largely now fallen by the wayside. Masons of those times saw marching in these parades as not only an honor and a privilege but also as a way to show our faces to the community. Now, the village of Penacook, where we are chartered, is reviving this tradition and is holding a Memorial Day parade on Sunday, May 29th. I have asked for dispensation to allow us to wear full Masonic regalia and have begun inviting Masons from across the state to join us, including Knights Templar in full uniform. Step-off time is at 10:00 a.m. at Penacook High School. Look for further details as we get closer.
