The Master's Message

Brethren,

I hope everyone has had a chance to enjoy a relatively quiet summer and spend some much-deserved time with their families. The time has come, however, for us to return to the quarries and resume our labors. September marks the traditional beginning of fall, and with it, our Masonic calendar starts to fill up again. This month, Inspection and Visitation season begins for our District, as well as Grand Lodge "Lodges of Instruction."

Before discussing what lies before us this month, a quick update on the library. After receiving a handful of wildly different—and very high—estimates from various contractors, a couple of us decided that we have the requisite skills in-house to perform the necessary repair work, and so have started to tackle it ourselves. Upon closer inspection, we determined that the center of the wall was still quite structurally sound, which allowed us to work on sections of the wall, one at a time, rather than tearing it down all in one shot. This has allowed us to chip away at it over the summer, with a few hours here and a few hours there. As I write this, the majority of the reframing has been completed, with a clear path in front of us for the completion of the project very soon. A much more detailed update will be given at the September Stated Communication.

Laying out our labors for September, we do, indeed, have a busy Masonic month.

First up, is our District's Lodge of Instruction on Saturday, September 9th, at 1:00 p.m. (12:00 p.m. lunch), at King Solomon's Lodge in Elkins (453 Elkins Rd., Elkins), presented by the Grand Lodge. For those who may be unaware, Lodges of Instruction are a formalized way for the Grand Lodge to impart education across the entire Masonic spectrum—from handling business to investigating candidates to ritualistic excellence—to all the Lodges within the jurisdiction. One LOI is held per district per year and, while the top five Lodge officers (Worshipful Master, Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Secretary, and Treasurer) are required to attend, all Master Masons are strongly encouraged to attend! In particular, all newly raised Master Masons are encouraged to attend so that the Grand Master can personally recognize them and welcome them to the Fraternity. If you are unable to attend our district's LOI on September 9th, you may attend any of the scheduled LOIs and still receive credit for attending. Next up is our District's first Visitation of the year, which is a joint Visitation for Blazing Star Eureka and Jewell Lodges on Wednesday, September 20th at the Concord Masonic Temple (53 Iron Works Rd., Concord). This also marks the first Visitation for our new District Deputy Grand Master, RW Brother Arthur Aznive. Dinner is at 6:00 p.m. with Lodge opening at 7:00 p.m. Please come and support both our DDGM and the other Lodges in our District if within the length of your Cable Tow!

Next up is our September Stated Communication on Thursday, September 21st. Lodge will open on the Entered Apprentice Degree so that all Masons—regardless of Degree—who have been longing to return to Lodge over the summer may attend. This month's education program will be a surprise, largely because I have several that I have been working on and have not decided which to go with yet, but all are appropriate for Masons of all Degrees and are intended to be open discussions, so please come and join in! Additionally, I've heard that the Stewards have a fun dinner in mind, but as they weren't 100% certain of it when I spoke with them, I don't want to accidentally commit them to it here. Needless to say, whatever they come up with will certainly be enjoyable!

Lastly, at the very end of the month on September 30th, we are reviving an old Horace Chase Lodge tradition by holding an OUTDOOR Master Mason Degree! Dispensation has been requested, initial site cleanup has been performed (thank you, Brothers Hardy, Hardy, and Willis!—sounds like a law firm!), and we have a Fellowcraft who has passed his proficiency and is ready to go! This Degree will also serve as our Inspection for this year. Combined with the fact that this is a Saturday afternoon Degree means we are expecting greater attendance than usual from other Lodges within the District.

Looking ahead beyond September, we have our own Visitation scheduled for Thursday, October 12th. In the old days, this was often considered the most important date on the calendar for a Lodge, as it provided the Lodge an opportunity to show its absolute best face to the Grand Master's hand-picked representative, to receive him with truly Grand honors, and to show off and be proud of the work that the Lodge was performing. In more recent times, however, this event has been viewed more as just another box to tick, just another meeting to attend. Our Lodge is known as one of the healthiest Lodges in the State, and it is due solely to the Brethren. Our Visitation is our chance to show that off and be an example that other Lodges can look to. Please save this date on your calendars so that we can have a large turnout for our DDGM!
